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



- SME instrument (4)
- and 5 more for Cofund Actions and specific cases

(***) The reimbursement of indirect eligible costs, in the case of coordination and support actions, may reach a maximum 7% of the direct eligible costs, excluding the direct eligible costs for subcontracting and the costs of resources made available by third parties which are not used on the premises of the *beneficiary*.

(****) Including research for the benefit of specific groups (in particular SMEs)



One project = One rate for research actions

- ✓ For all beneficiaries and activities in the grant.
- ☑ Defined in the Work Programme:
 - Up to 100 % of the eligible costs for research actions;
 - Up to 70 % for innovation actions (exception for non-profit organisations – up to 100%).




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Forms of costs

Actual costs	 Costs actually incurred, identifiable and verifiable, recorded in the accounts, etc. NEW: non-deductible VAT paid is also eligible
Unit costs	 A fixed amount per unit determined by the Commission. Example: SME owners' unit cost For average personnel cost (based on the usual accounting practices)
Lump sum	• A global amount to cover one or several cost categories Example: Phase 1 of the SME instrument
Flat rate	• A percentage to be calculated on the eligible costs
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Single FLAT RATE for indirect costs

Simplifying project management and removing recurrent errors.

Duration and start date of the action






- ⇒ By default: the month following the entry into force
- ⇒ Only if justified: fixed date
 - Seneral rule: later than the date of entry into force
 - Exceptionally: between the date of the submission of grant application and the entry into force


Subcontractors

• Similar to FP7 Special Clause 10

- Must be identified in the GA
- Same <u>cost</u> eligibility criteria than beneficiaries
- **NEW**: COM or Agency may request them to accept joint and several liability for their EU contribution
- Article 14 MGA



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- Ensure best value for money and avoid any conflict of interests
- Estimated costs and tasks must be identified in the budget and Annex 1
- NEW: if not identified in Annex 1, Commission may still approve them (beneficiary bears the risk of rejection)
- Article 13 MGA



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THIRD PARTIES: others



Contracts necessary for the implementation

Contributions in kind

- For the purchase of goods, works or services
- Ensure best value for money and avoid any conflict of interests
- Article 10 MGA
- <u>Free of charge or against</u> <u>payment</u> are eligible costs if they meet the eligibility conditions
- Must be set out in Annex 1
- **NEW**: if not identified in Annex 1, Commission may still approve them (beneficiary bears the risk of rejection)
- Articles 11 & 12 MGA



eneficiary

Financial support to third parties

- 'Cascading grants': Equivalent to FP7 Special Clause 42
- **Prizes**: awarded by the beneficiary as part of the action
- Option to be used <u>ONLY</u> if foreseen in the Work Programme
- Conditions set out in Annex 1
- Article 15 MGA



PERSONNEL COSTS: novelties

Less requirements for time records

Example: No time records for researchers working exclusively on the project.

Wider acceptance of average personnel costs

Broadening the acceptance of usual cost accounting practices (including cost-centre approaches) as unit costs.

Acceptance of additional remuneration


- \rightarrow Limited to non-profit legal entities
- → Up to 8000 Euro/year/person working full-time exclusively in the action
- \rightarrow Subject to specific conditions








PERSONNEL COSTS: overview

Hourly rate


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Actual personnel costs: calculation - I




→ The hourly rate is to be calculated **per financial year**

➔ If the financial year is not closed at the time of reporting, the beneficiary must use the last closed financial year available.

ADVANTAGES FOR THE BENEFICIARIES

- NO ADJUSTMENTS TO BE DECLARED IN THE NEXT PERIOD
- LEGAL CERTAINTY: NO DOUBTS ABOUT WHAT PERIOD AND WHAT DATA MUST BE USED FOR THE CALCULATION
- REMOVES ERRORS DUE TO INCORRECT CALCULATIONS FOR FRACTIONS OF A YEAR

Average of the daily exchange rates published in the Official Journal of the EU calculated over the reporting period.



No-profit rule applied at project level, not per beneficiary!

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Final grant amount: calculation

Step 1 — Application of reimbursement rates to eligible costs

Total approved eligible costs (actual costs, unit costs, flat-rate and lump sum costs, if any) X reimbursement rate (100 % for research actions, 70% for innovation actions)

Step 2 — Limit to the maximum grant amount

The grant amount obtained in Step 1 is capped at the maximum grant amount set out in the GA

The grant amount following Steps 1 and 2 is the lower of the two amounts.

Step 3 — Reduction due to the no-profit rule

Profit of the action = Grant amount obtained in Step 2 + Receipts – Total eligible costs of the action

If Profit > 0 \rightarrow grant amount obtained in Step 2 is reduced

If Profit < or = $0 \rightarrow$ grant amount obtained in Step 2 is not reduced

Step 4 — Reduction due to improper implementation or breach of other obligations under the GA at the payment of the balance

Final grant amount is the lower of the following two amounts:

Amount obtained following Steps 1 to 3 \Leftrightarrow Amount obtained in Step 4



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
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Project implementation







- Maximum five months from call closure date to end of evaluation
 until the date of informing applicants
- Maximum three months to prepare grant agreement from the date of inviting (informing) applicants until the signature of the grant agreement



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Reporting and payments

- 1 pre-financing to provide a "float" (positive cash flow)
- 1 or several interim payments
- 1 payment of the balance
- Pre- and interim payments (including the 5% for the guarantee fund, see RfP 38, 39) cannot exceed 90% of the maximum grant amount
- Financial statements must be drafted in \in (MGA Art. 20.6)
 - beneficiaries with non-€ accounting: currency conversion based on the average of the daily exchange rates of the reporting period as published in the C series of the Official journal of the European Union
- The final report contains a "Certificate on the financial statement"
 - for each beneficiary that requests a total EU contribution >=€325'000.



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Intellectual Property Rights

✓ Ownership

- for the beneficiary who generates results,
- joint-ownership only in specific circumstances;

✓ Protection

- where appropriate
- ✓ Exploitation
- General obligation to exploit
- ✓ Dissemination
- General obligation to disseminate





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Intellectual Property Rights - results

FP7 Background stays Background (MGA 24)

- any data, know-how or information, whatever its form or nature, tangible or intangible, including any attached rights (e.g. patent or database rights):
- held by participants prior to their accession to the grant agreement,
- needed to implement the project or to exploit its results, and
- identified by participants in a written agreement (MGA 24).

FP 7 Foreground becomes Results (=any output of project) (MGA 26.1)

- any tangible or intangible output of the action, whatever its form or nature (e.g. cell lines or prototypes), including any attached rights (e.g. patent or database rights).
- Access Rights (MGA 25.1) means rights to use Results or Background under the terms and conditions laid down in the Agreement

Unless agreed otherwise, access rights do not include the r sub-license.



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Intellectual Property Rights – use of IPR

Purpose	Access to background	Access to results	
Implementation of the project	Royalty-free, unless otherwise agreed by participants before their accession to the grant agreement	Royalty-free	
Exploitation of project results	Subject to agreement, access rights shall be granted under fair and reasonable conditions (which can be royalty-free)		

Due to the extended definition of affiliated entity in Horizon 2020, "parent" companies also have minimum access rights to results or background under the same conditions of the other affiliates if such access is needed to exploit the results generated by the participant to which it is affiliated, and unless otherwise agreed in the consortium agreement (CA).



Intellectual Property Rights – ownership II

Ownership and Use of Results

 Joint ownership (MGA 26.2): Only once results are generated, joint owners may opt for a different regime than joint ownership

- General obligation to protect Results (MGA 27.1)
 - if possible, reasonable and justified
 - consider legitimate interests of the other beneficiaries
 - indicate EU funding for application or possible grant reduction (MGA 27.3)

General obligation to exploit the Results (MGA 28)



Intellectual Property Rights - ownership

Ownership and Use of Results

Results are owned by the beneficiary that generated them (MGA) 26.1)

- Be careful with rights of your personnel (e.g. ©) (MGA 26.3)
- •EU ownership for Result protection (MGA 26.4)
 - with consent of beneficiary and up to 4 years after project end
 - if a beneficiary intends to disseminate without protection except if not réasonable or there is a lack of commercial potential
 - before dissemination and unless valid exceptions (who is the judge of this) the beneficiary must formally notify the EU
 - give reasons to withhold consent for EU ownership arguing its legitimate interests would suffer significant harm
 - EU decision within 45 days
 - in analogy also valid if beneficiary intends to stop protection within 4 years after project end (MGA 26.4.2)
 obligation to inform with 60 days notice



Intellectual Property Rights - access

✓ Open access

- obligatory for scientific publications and,
- to research data (in appropriate areas and if foreseen in the work programme)

✓ Additional exploitation / dissemination obligations

if in the work programme

Visibility of EU funding

Use of emblem and standard sentence

✓ Access rights(MGA 31.5)

- rights for the Union Royalty-free access for policy related purposes to Results generated with Union funding (strictly limited to non-commercial and non-competitive use)
- For actions in Secure Societies such access rights apply also for Member States



Intellectual Property Rights - transfer

Transfer and (exclusive) licences outside the Union/Associated Countries

- the grant agreement may foresee right to object if a beneficiary has received Union funding
- Tailor-made provisions for specific actions & in the specific models



Dissemination of Results

- General obligation to disseminate Results (MGA 29.1)
 - 45 days notice to other beneficiaries who may object within 30 days
- Obligatory Open Access to scientific publications (MGA 29.2)
 - beneficiary must as soon as possible but latest on publication deposit an e- copy in repository
 - aim also to deposit the research data needed to verify publication
 - ensure open access to the deposited publication at the latest
 on publication if available free of charge

 - within six months (12 for SSH) in other cases
- Pilot Open Access to research data (MGA 29.3)
 - establishment of a data management plan
 - objection is possible if justified
- Information on EU funding, unless EU agrees otherwise (MGA 29.4)
 - dissemination must include EU emblem and
 - specific text on EU funding (29.4) as well as
 - specific disclaimer (29.5)



Financial viability

Short beneficiaries exempt from detailed analysis; only systematic check for coordinators when requested EU funding for the action is ≥ EUR 500 000

Certificates

- ⇒ Certificate on the financial statements: Only for final payments when total EU contribution claimed by the beneficiary on the basis of actual costs + unit costs for average personnel ≥ EUR 325.000 (▲ excluding e.g. flat rates !)
- Certificate on the methodology: <u>Optional</u> for average personnel costs (now under unit costs)



Controls and audits: ex-post

Ex-post audits

Audits of the Commission limited to two years after the payment of the balance

Extension of audit findings

⇒ Former "extrapolation" (FP7) now included in the MGA

In the case of systemic or recurrent errors, irregularities, fraud or breach of obligations
